Genesis 18: 1-8 ~ The Inclusive Bible

God appeared to Abraham by the oak grove of Mamre, while Abraham sat at the entrance to his tent in the heat of the day. Looking up, Abraham saw three travelers standing nearby.

Which of these three, in your opinion, was the neighbor to the traveler who fell in with the robbers?"

The answer came, "The one who showed compassion."

Jesus replied, "Then go and do the same."

As they traveled, Jesus entered a village where a woman named Martha, welcomed him to her home. She had a sister named Mary, who seated herself at Jesus' feet and listened to his words.

Martha, who was busy with all the details of hospitality, came to Jesus and said, "Rabbi, don't you care that my sister has left me all alone to do the household tasks? Tell her to help me!"


