Habakuk 1: 1-4, 2: 1-4 ~ The Inclusive Bible

The oracle that Habakuk the prophet received in a vision.

"How long, God, am I to cry for help while you do not listen? How long will I cry 'Oppression!' in your ear and you do not save? Why do you make me look upon injustice? Why do you countenance tyranny? Outrage and violence—this is all I see! All is contention, and discord flourishes. The law loses its hold, and justice never shows itself. The corrupt triumph over those who are righteous, and justice is perverted once again."...

I will stand on my watchtower, and take up my post on my battlements, watching to see what God will say to me, what answers God will make to my complaints.

Then God replied, "Write down this vision, inscribe it legibly on tablets so that a herald can easily read it, since this vision will stand as a witness to the appointed time of judgment; it gives faithful testimony about a time that will come. If it is slow in coming, wait for it—for come it will, without fail:

Look—those whose hearts are corrupt will faint with exhaustion, while those who steadfastly uphold justice will live."

2 Timothy 1: 1-10 ~ The Inclusive Bible

From Paul, by the will of God an apostle of Christ Jesus, sent to proclaim the promise of life in Christ Jesus,

To Timothy, my dear child:

May grace, mercy and peace from God the Creator and from Christ Jesus our Savior be with you.

I thank God, the God of my ancestors—whom I worship with a clear conscience—whenever I remember you in my prayers, as indeed I do constantly, night and day. When I recall your tears, I long to see you again, which would fill me with joy. I'm reminded of your sincere faith, which first lived in your grandmother Lois, then in your mother Eunice, and now, I'm certain, in you as well. That's why I want to remind you to fan into flame the gift of God, which is in you through the laying on of my hands. For God didn't give us a spirit of timidity, but a spirit of power, of love, of self-discipline.

So don't be ashamed to give your testimony about Christ, and don't be ashamed of me, Christ's prisoner. But join with me in suffering for the Gospel by the power of God, who has saved us and called us to a holy life—not because of anything we have done, but because of God's own purpose and grace. This grace was given to us in Christ Jesus before the beginning of time, but it has now been revealed through the appearing of our Savior Jesus Christ, who has destroyed death, and brought life and immortality to light through the Gospel.

Holy Communion is open to members and friends of all ages We welcome you in the name of Jesus, whom we follow in the way of radically inclusive love


Our bread is gluten free, spaced out across a tray Juice is served in individual cups.



*For the ecosystems and human residents of Cuba and Florida in the aftermath of Hurricane Ian. May people be connected with resources as communities clean up and rebuild.


