Proclaiming God's Love

Scriptures

Isaiah 42: 1-9 ~ *The Inclusive Bible (responsive)*

Here is my Servant, whom I uphold – my chosen one, in whom I delight! I have endowed you with my Spirit, that you may bring true justice to the nations.

You do not cry out or raise your voice, or make yourself heard in the street.

So gentle that you do not break a bruised reed, or quench a wavering flame; faithfully you will bring forth true justice.

You will neither waver nor be crushed until justice is established on Earth, for the islands await your teaching!

Thus says God, who created the heavens and spread them out, who gave shape to the Earth and what it produces, who gave life to its peoples and spirit to its inhabitants:

I, God, have called you to serve the cause of right; I have taken you by the hand, and I watch over you. I have appointed you to be a covenant people, a light to the nations:

To open the eyes of the blind, to free captives from prison, and those who sit in darkness from the dungeon.

I am God! This is my name! I will not yield my glory to another god or my praise to idols!

See how former predictions have come true. And now I declare new things!

Before they spring forth, I tell them to you.

Matthew 3: 1-17 ~ *The Inclusive Bible*

At this time John the Baptizer appeared in the desert of Judea, proclaiming, “Change your hearts and minds, for the reign of heaven is about to break in upon you!”

It was John that the prophet Isaiah described when he said, “A herald's voice cries in the desert: ‘Prepare the way of our God, make straight the paths of God!’”

John was clothed in a garment of camel’s hair and wore a leather belt around his waist. Grasshoppers and wild honey were his food. At that time, Jerusalem, all Judea and the whole region around the Jordan were going out to him. John baptized them in the Jordan River as they confessed their sins.

When he saw that many of the Pharisees and Sadducees were coming to be baptized, John said to them, “You pack of snakes! Who told you to flee from the coming wrath? Give some evidence that you mean to reform! And don’t pride yourselves on the claim, ‘Sarah and Abraham are our parents.’ I tell you, God can raise children for Sarah and Abraham from these very stones! Even now the ax is laid to the root of the tree. Every tree that is not fruitful will be cut down and thrown into the fire. I will baptize you in water if you have a change of heart, but one who will follow me is more powerful than I. I’m not fit even to untie the sandals of the Coming One! That one will baptize you in the Holy Spirit and fire, whose winnowing-fan will clear the threshing floor. The grain will be gathered into the barn, but the chaff will be burned in unquenchable fire.”

Then Jesus came from Galilee to the Jordan to be baptized by John. John tried to dissuade Jesus, saying, “I should be baptized by you, and yet you come to me!”

But Jesus replied, “Leave it this way for now. We must do this to completely fulfill God’s justice.” So John reluctantly agreed.

Immediately after Jesus had been baptized and was coming up out of the water, the sky suddenly opened up and Jesus saw the Spirit of God descending as a dove and hovering over him. With that, a voice from the heavens said, “This is my own, my beloved, on whom my favor rests.”
