*Hear an update regarding merging with St. Peter's United Church of Christ

*Discuss and vote on adding an affiliation with the MN Conference United Church of Christ (UCC) alongside our affiliation with the National Association of Congregational Christian Churches (NACCC)

Update: On April 22, the Committee on Ministry (COM) of the MN Conference UCC met in our Fellowship Hall. As part of their agenda, Rolf Dittmann and Pastor Clare met with them to discuss our congregation's interest in becoming affiliated with the UCC. Based on that conversation, COM unanimously forwarded to the MN Conference UCC Board of Directors the recommendation that People's Congregational Church be received into affiliation.

*Discuss and vote on several edits to our bylaws (adding UCC affiliation and an adjustment to Leadership Team configuration).

Note: Votes on bylaw changes require at least 1/4 quorum (17 members) of the congregation.
