
*For safe travels for all who gathered with loved ones for Thanksgiving. And for Love to accompany those who are alone this holiday weekend.


Inquirer's Gathering for newer and long-time friends alike... Come learn from lay leaders and Pastor Clare about the life and work of St. Croix United Church.
