# Advent Candle Liturgy (responsive)

We come to this season of Advent and gather around... We are empowered by the advent of Emmanuel, God with Us, because of whom Isaiah prophesied no bruised reed would be broken nor dimly burning wick quenched until justice fills all that lives and grows. We light the candle of HOPE for Earth and air and seas, for the creatures dwelling among us and the plants alive with God's Spirit. Let us pray:

Emmanuel, we celebrate the Advent of the past with its precious words and traditions, and we light an Advent of new hope for all the seasons of your children. Amen.




