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
## **Acknowledging Our Need for God's Grace**

#### **Words of Invitation**

God of the winding path, you are within and around us always. Touch us in some new, tangible way through this meal tonight. Reassure us — through the kindness in a neighbor's eye, the strength of bread, and the savor of the cup — that you move with us along the journey. Amen.

## **Words of Remembrance and Blessing**

\*Sharing the Bread of Life and Cup of Blessing

Please approach the serving table by the center aisle Take a piece of (gluten-free) bread and a cup of juice, receiving words of blessing Place your empty cup in a basket on a front pew, returning by a side aisle


