A Song from the Prophets | "The First Song of Isaiah" Congregation joins when the refrain repeats Isaiah 12:2-6

Refrain: Surely, it is God who saves me; I will trust in God and not be afraid. For the Lord is my stronghold and my sure defense, and God will be my Savior.

Therefore you shall draw water with rejoicing from the springs of salvation and on that day you shall say, "Give thanks to the Lord and call upon God's name." [Refrain] Make God's deeds known among the peoples; see that they remember that the Lord is exalted. Sing the praises of the Lord, for God has done great things and this is known in all the world. [Refrain] Cry aloud, inhabitants of Zion; ring out your joy, for the great one in the midst of you is the Holy One of Israel. [Refrain]

Here ends the readings. May God speak to us through these sacred words.
