## (CHEMICAL FREE) COMMUNITY GARDENS AGREEMENT

- Garden plots at SHCG for the 2025 gardening season will be assigned after the gardener returns the
  Garden Plot Reservation form with the plot fee and a signed copy of this agreement to the Treasurer of
  the Community Gardens. Plots will be assigned on a first-come, first-serve basis. If there are no plots
  available at the time your registration is received, you will have the option of being placed on a waiting
  list and your plot fee will be returned. You will be contacted should a plot become available. Plot fees
  may be paid in cash, or check made out to "South Hill Community Garden" and mailed to Cindy Baker,
  13971 60th Court N #107 Oak Park Heights, MN 55082. The plot fees include one season use of the
  plot and water.
- Plot assignment preferences: 1<sup>st</sup> year everyone can pick a plot, the next year the existing gardeners can be first to pick a plot or keep the same plot they started with.
- All gardeners (or a representative) are required to attend one of the Spring Meetings that will be scheduled in mid-May, participate in garden workdays and maintain their garden plot. The Spring Meeting will be held at South Hill Community Garden (111 Orleans St E, Stillwater).
- Garden plots are assigned to one person only and are not transferable during the current or future seasons. Others may garden at your site, but the responsibility for payment of fees, clean-up and other duties at the site will be the responsibility of the individual whose name is assigned to the plot.
- SHCG will be open from dawn to dusk, May 1<sup>st</sup> to November 1<sup>st</sup>. You must tend your plot by June 1<sup>st</sup> and you are responsible to keep it weeded as well as trim weeds/grass around your plot bed. Call (651-491-4044) if for any reason (health, vacation, work schedule, etc.) you will be temporarily unable to maintain your plot. If your plot appears abandoned, it could be reassigned to someone else and you will not be eligible for a plot the following year.
- All dead plants, weeds, garden stakes, etc. must be removed by November 1<sup>st</sup>.
- SHCG bans the use of tobacco and illegal drugs in and around the garden. Guns are strictly prohibited.
   Growing illegal substances or using tobacco, drugs or possessing a weapon will lead to immediate expulsion with no return of plot fee.
- SHCG is "chemical free" gardens, meaning no chemical fertilizers, pesticides, herbicides, plant food, etc. may be used in the garden.
- Do not plant trees, shrubs or perennials in your plot.
- Please be aware of neighboring plots and strategically place tall plants or plants requiring support/structures so they are not shading other plots.
- The path around plots is to provide gardeners access to their plots. Help maintain the path around your
  plot by keeping it clear of weeds, rocks, and other garden obstacles. Keep vegetation within your plot
  and when planting near paths leave adequate space for plant growth so as not to overhang into the
  paths or other plots.
- Do not bring sand or gravel in the garden area. Mulching with leaves, grass clippings, hay or straw to reduce evaporation and unwanted weeds is acceptable. The use of plastic and other non-porous materials for ground cover is discouraged.
- Water hoses must not cross other plots and must be attended at all times. Be diligent in shutting the water off after you use it.
- If a city watering ban is in effect, you must comply with the regulations.
- Put compost and trash in the compost bins or trashcans. Plant material should not be in the trashcans
  unless it is diseased or infested and there is a known risk of contaminating the compost site. The use
  of the compost from the bin will be discussed at a garden meeting/workday so that everyone has input
  into how to best use the compost.
- ONLY harvest from your plot (the plot you are planting) unless another plot owner has given you permission.
- Treat fellow gardeners with respect and consideration.
- Parents are encouraged to bring children to the garden and introduce them to gardening. Supervise your children and teach them to stay on garden paths.
- Dogs or other family pets are not allowed in the garden. Outside of the garden, dogs must be leashed and you need to pick up after them.
