Prayer of Confession and Longing (responsive)

Loving God in heaven and on Earth, forgive us our debts.

We have not ensured every human being those qualities of life that you call us to provide. We admit the part we owe to the debts of freedom, security, equality, and identity – for all people. Have mercy on your people.

Forgive us our trespasses.

We have sometimes invaded the boundaries of other peoples' lives so that we might have the best and most for our own lives. Because we have not always respected the lives of others – the poor are still poor, the hungry are still hungry, and the unseen are still unseen. Have mercy on your people.

Forgive us our sins.

We have turned our hearts away from you. Through private thoughts or public actions, we have rebelled against your laws and your will. We confess that we have not kept your commandments. We have not loved you, others, ourselves. Have mercy on your people.

Help us to forgive. We have not received what we expected. Our lives have been stepped on. We have been hurt by others.

We ask for the transforming power of the Holy Spirit to guide us on our path of repentance. Amen.




